

Harley History

The Panhead V-Twin

The Panhead engine was introduced in 1948 and produced until 1965. It got its nickname from the rocker covers which resembled upside-down roasting pans. It replaced the Knucklehead engine. The primary changes were the aluminum heads which helped to reduce operating temperatures and the introduction of hydraulic valve lifters that reduced engine noise. The bottom section of the engine was basically the same as the Knucklehead with minor modifications to the engine cases as well as a new camshaft for the new valve system.

The Panhead's engine was a two-cylinder, two-valve-per-cylinder, pushrod V-twin. It came in two displacement versions: the 74 cubic inch, which was installed in the FL and

FLH bikes, and a 61 cubic inch, which was installed in the EL series bikes. With its 7:1 compression ratio, output was 55 hp at 4,800 rpm in the 74 cubic inch version. The transmission was a 4-speed unit.

The Panhead was redesigned in 1955 so that larger engine casings could be fitted to it.

Since the engine was taller than the Knucklehead, the frames were redesigned with double down-tubes. The frame became known as the "wishbone" frame and came with a mounting plate for engine guards as well as a steering lock.

The "Captain America" chopper ridden by Peter Fonda in the movie *Easy Rider* had a Panhead engine, as did the "Billy Bike" ridden by Dennis Hopper.

In 1966, the Motor Company replaced the Panhead with the Shovelhead, which was quieter, cleaner and more efficient.



LOH Ride will Honor Longtime H-D Ambassador Nancy Davidson

Join the LOH for a ride to honor Sturgis Hall of Famer Nancy Davidson, 89, who died July 12 after a long battle with cancer.



Our memorial ride will be on Saturday, August 21 under the BIG sign at Rockstar Harley-Davidson. Arrive at 9 A.M., kickstands up at 9:30 A.M.

Nancy and Willie G. Davidson married in 1957. She was working as a schoolteacher and when Willie joined Harley-Davidson in 1963, she focused on raising her family.

When Harley-Davidson launched the Harley Owners Group in 1983, Nancy and Willie connected with Harley-Davidson customers through shared riding experiences. Together, Willie and Nancy logged thousands of miles, getting to know some of Harley-Davidson's most loyal and committed riders.

The couple traveled together to hundreds of motorcycle events, including Daytona Bike Week, Sturgis and many international events. In 2010, Nancy was inducted into the Sturgis Motorcycle Museum Hall of Fame, in recognition of her long-term positive impact on the motorcycling community.

Nancy is survived by her husband, three children, and one granddaughter. Willie G., 78, the grandson of one of the company's founders, is the son of William H. Davidson, Harley's second president. He retired in 2012 as senior vice president and chief styling officer. The first Sturgis Motorcycle Rally was August 14, 1938.

Since August hosts the world's largest bike rally, let's take a look at how it all began. The first Sturgis motorcycle rally was held on August 14, 1938. The event was organized by the town's motorcycle club called



the Jackpine Gypsies, who bought and developed large tracks, hill climbs and field areas where the rally would be held.

Clarence "Pappy" Hoel was credited with founding the event when he bought a franchise of the Indian Motorcycle Company (a manufacturer of motorcycles in North Carolina) in Sturgis during 1936. After that, he organized the Jackpine Gypsies.

During the first few years, the Sturgis motorcycle rally focused on racing and stunts, testing the participant's various riding skills, courage and stunt creativity. By the 1960s, the rally action expanded with hill climbs and motocross. Audiences saw more daredevil maneuvers like the half-mile track racing, ramp jumps, head-on automobile crashes and board wall crashes, the reasons for the tremendous popularity of the event today. The only time that the Sturgis Motorcycle Rally was canceled was 1942, at the height of World War II.

The Sturgis Motorcycle Rally continues to reap the support and attendance of both participants and motorcycle fans all over the United States and in some parts of the world. In 2015, a record 739,000 attended the rally's 75th anniversary, including entire families who came with their RVs and rode the few last miles to Sturgis on their motorcycles.

SAFETY OFFICER'S MESSAGE



How to Handle a Motorcycle Tire Blowout

With today's tubeless tires, actual blowouts are rare, but may still occur. When tires do fail, the most common cause is improper tire pressure, usually pressure that's too low. Checking the overall condition and pressure levels of your tires frequently can go a long way toward ensuring you'll never experience a blowout.

However, if one of your motorcycle's tires should fail while you're riding, you'll need to react quickly and decisively to avert a crash. So take a few minutes now to familiarize yourself with the following steps for successfully handling motorcycle tire blowouts:

- 1. Ease off the throttle and slow down gradually.
- 2. Do not use the brakes. Braking, especially braking hard, will only make keeping control of your motorcycle even more difficult. If you must use some brake, apply gradual force to the brake on the good tire and ease your motorcycle to a safe stop.

Caution: Using the brake on the wheel with the bad tire can cause the tire to separate from the rim, resulting in immediate loss of control. Be aware, however, that integrated braking systems don't permit rear-brake-only applications, while linked braking systems do not allow for singlebrake operation. On motorcycles with either of these two systems, braking with the good tire only may not be possible. Any braking necessary should be done very lightly and with great care. Avoid downshifting too. Like braking, this will only make your bike less stable.



- 3. Firmly hold on to the handlebars while keeping your arms bent. Do not "fight" the steering to correct the wobble or weave that will likely develop. Focus instead on maintaining control by keeping your motorcycle directed in as straight a line as possible until it comes to a stop.
- 4. Remain seated until your motorcycle has come to a full stop.
- 5. Once stopped, push your motorcycle as far away from the travel lanes as possible.

While tire blowouts are not common, the absolute best way to "handle one" is to avert it before it happens.
