Galisano Children's Hospital has decided the Annual Easter Bunny Toy Run, to the Children's Hospital, should be canceled again this year, because of the pandemic.

Make sure you don't miss our March 14th general membership meeting at Lakes Park in Fort Myers. This is an opportunity for us to meet outside in an open pavilion and end our meeting with a nice boxed lunch. Lake Park is a beautiful area, with plenty of parking and a lot of activities to continue your enjoyment of the day.

The ride to Daytona Bike Week looks to have a good turnout. Ten rooms were blocked at the Hampton Inn in New Smyrna Beach. After 11 rooms were booked, we added 5 more to be held at \$145, plus tax, per night, to be held until February 12th. We will depart Rockstar Harley-Davidson at 8:30 a.m. on Tuesday, March 9th and plan to return on Thursday, March 11th.

As there was very little interest in a double overnight ride to Brooksville for the Leesburg Bike Fest, that trip is canceled. There was very little interest in a St. Patrick's Day evening dinner ride. We will have our regularly scheduled Wednesday ride, on March 17th, at 9:30 a.m., and work toward an Irish lunch.

As we meet for our Wednesday and Saturday rides, please enter the dealership through the main entrance, by the reception desk, or through the gate and side entrance into the Biker Café. The Rockstar sales staff hold their morning meetings near the Sales Department entrance so entering the building through those doors interrupts their morning routine.

We are working to ensure none of our riders are left behind if our rides are split up at traffic lights or other traffic situations. The remainder of the first group will slow down or wait in a safe area until everyone catches up.

Strategy for Safely Crossing Train Rails

Railroad tracks have caused more than a few motorcycle crashes. That may be because steel rails don't look especially dangerous. The crashes are rarely fatal, but any crash can be painful and expensive.

Let's consider a few hazards created by rails in the road surface, and offer some tactics for keeping the shiny side up.



Shiny surfaces, such as rails, are a specific problem for motorcycles because balancing a bike is mostly a matter of

steering the front wheel to adjust the position of the contact patch. If your front tire slides for more than a second or two, you can lose control of steering, and not be able to keep the bike upright. A polished steel rail or groove can allow the front tire to slide.

Many cities have industrial areas once served by railroad sidings. Today most commercial shipments are by truck, but often the

abandoned rails remain, creating surface hazards for the unwary motorcyclist.

Where two tracks join or cross each other, there will be V or X-shaped slots shaped to allow train wheels to roll through. There are often thin plates lining the slots to help prevent pavement and debris from clogging the train wheel grooves. The slots and grooves can easily capture your front tire, wresting steering from your control.

If you don't have to cross the slippery rails, avoid them. But when you must cross, cross at a maximum angle, with the bike as vertical as possible. If multiple tracks converge, plan a line that provides the best traction and keeps your tires out of any V or X grooves.

As with any surface hazard, it will help to keep your weight firmly on the pegs or floorboards when crossing railroad tracks.
